





STATIONS IN DETAIL


LA-STATION 1. INFECTION CONTROL/WASTE MANAGEMENT/KNOT TYING/LIP TWITCH (5 MIN)

- Principles of infection control
- Sort medical waste into the appropriate waste streams
- Tie a specified knot (from the knot tying video) relevant to LA restraint methods
- Demonstrate correct application of a lip twitch on Cisco Ramon (the model!)




LA-STATION 2. ANATOMY (10 MIN)

- Topographical landmarks and anatomical structures on the live animal
- For more detailed information about this station, please contact Dr. Thomason



LA-STATION 3. BOVINE RESTRAINT AND PE (5 MIN)


- Perform specified restraint techniques
 - Everyone will need to place a halter and tie a quick release knot
 - Other restraint techniques may be asked, for example:
 - Tail jack, tail tie, rope placement for casting (your examiner can assist you if you direct them on what to do), etc...
- Demonstrate aspects of the bovine Physical Exam
 - Includes only those techniques that would be considered part of the routine general exam (ie not in small font and italics in the notes)



LA-STATION 4. BOVINE BODY CONDITION SCORING (5 MIN)

- No examiner present.
- Pick up your designated scoring sheet (based on whether you are A, B, or C) and on the sheet you will have been assigned 2 specific cows to assess for Body Condition Score
 - Be prepared to explain what criteria you used on each cow to assign the BCS
 - Do not assess any cows other than those you were assigned (=0marks)
 - BSC can be in 0.5 increments


Bring your BSC Station 4 sheet with you and hand it in at the next station! (Station 5 – Small Ruminants)



LA-STATION 5. SMALL RUMINANT RESTRAINT AND PE (5 MIN)

- Wait at the plastic curtain until called upon.
- Hand in your Station 4 BCS sheet!!
- This station includes basic handling and restraint methods, as well as aspects of the physical examination


Yes, you need to be able to efficiently and humanely catch a specific animal, and tip it up!



LA-STATION 6. LA BEDDING AND FEEDSTUFFS (5 MIN)


- No examiner present.
- You will be asked to identify a feedstuff and explain its nutritional qualities (compared to another feedstuff) OR identify a bedding and explain its pros and cons
- You will also be expected to know how to calculate daily feeding and water requirements for a horse or cow.
 - A calculator will be provided please do not remove it from the station!
 - You cannot use your phone



LA-STATION 7. EQUINE RESTRAINT AND PHYSICAL EXAMINATION (5 MIN)

- Wait at the entrance to C wing until you are called. Please wait quietly!
- You may need to place a halter and lead shank on a horse
- You will be asked to perform components of the equine physical examination (all components of the handout, EXCEPT holding the tongue to check the molars... do not practice this – it is NOT on the exam!)





1. SA VIDEO STATION (10 MIN)

- Watch a video of a simulated client interaction (room 1713 or 1715)
- Identify:
 - Presenting complaint, other important history items
 - Problem list
 - Veterinarian's AVM skills

2. LIVE DOG STATION (10 MIN)

- In rooms 1701 or 1702
- Restraint & handling
 - Restrain dog in sitting, standing, or lateral recumbency
 - Hold off a peripheral vein for venipuncture
- Anatomy
 - Know topographical landmarks reviewed in anatomy course lab notes/sessions

2. LIVE DOG STATION (CONTINUED)

- Physical examination
 - Marks for proper attire & equipment (labcoat, stethoscope, etc)
 - Marks for safe animal interactions
 - Majority of marks for PE skills:
 - E.g., oral exam, thoracic auscultation assess heart rate & rhythm, show abdominal palpation technique/knowledge of structures, find peripheral LN/show technique, examine limbs, discuss normal rectal exam findings
 - To the level of detail in the lab notes
- Proper handwashing technique

3. SA NUTRITION STATION (5 MIN)

- Rooms 1602 A, B, or C
- Nutrition
 - Given a bag of pet food
 - Identify & interpret the meaning of a pet food label claim, AAFCO statements, other label aspects
- Biggest emphasis on:
 - Lecture 1 & 2 Pet food industry & understanding pet foods
 - Lecture 3 Alternative diets with a focus on how to implement the "Quick Assessment of Homemade Diets"
 - Lecture 4 Nutritional assessment
 - Class notes "Reading Pet Food labels"
- Other resources provided on Courselink can be used for clarifying concepts.

4. SUTURE STATION (5 MIN)

- Room 1618 (Anatomy Lab)
- 1 simple interrupted suture
 - As though you were placing a suture in the linea alba
- Demonstrate (at the level of a Phase 1 student):
 - Proper technique & instrument handling
 - Efficiency in surgical motion
 - Proper square knots
 - Overall proper suturing technique
- Instruments are provided at the exam
- You will be suturing DASIEs
 - Same as recent lab sessions
